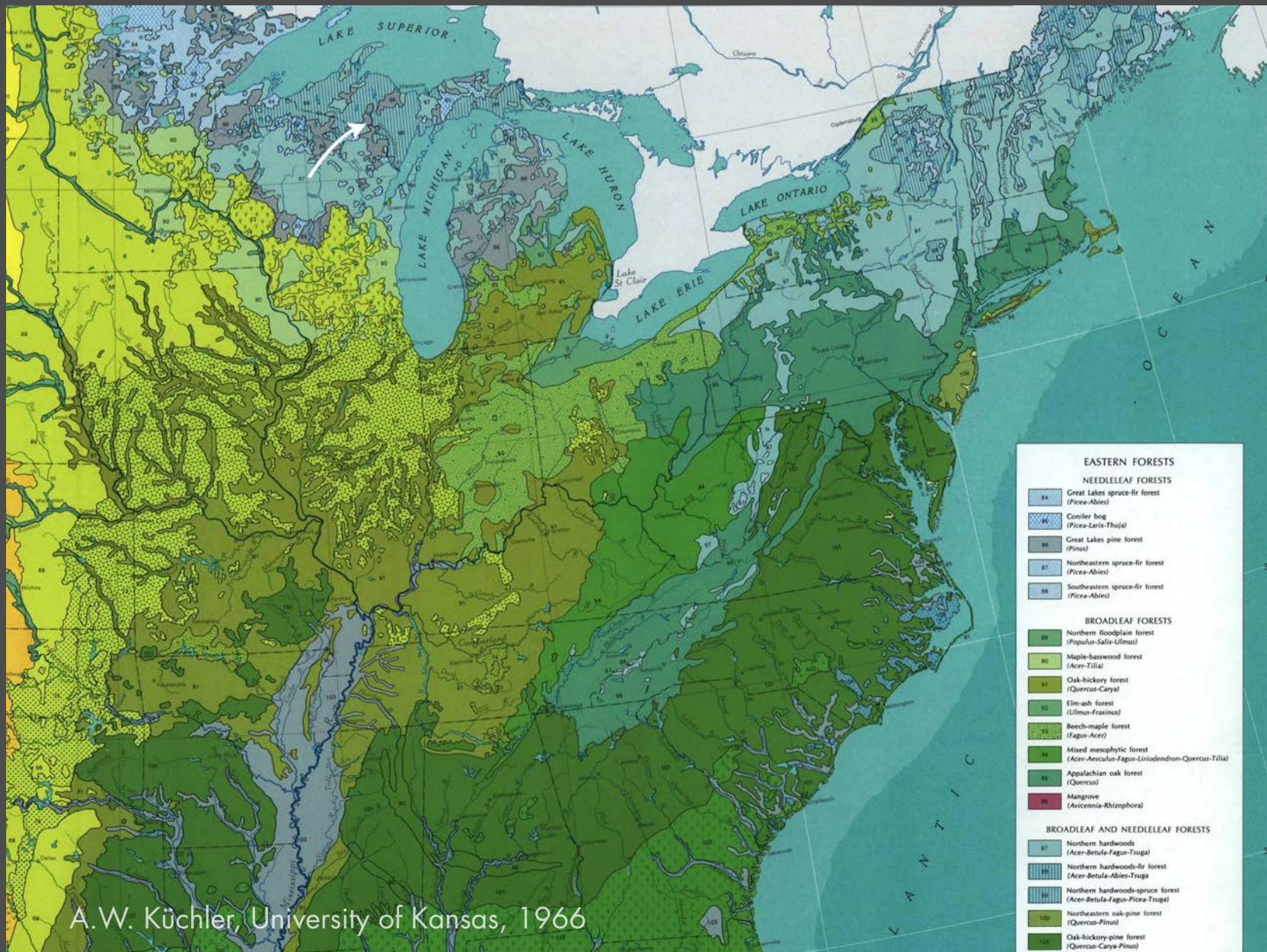

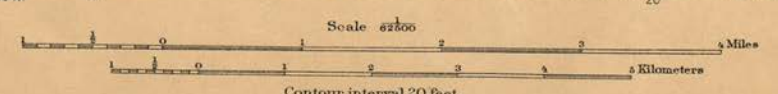

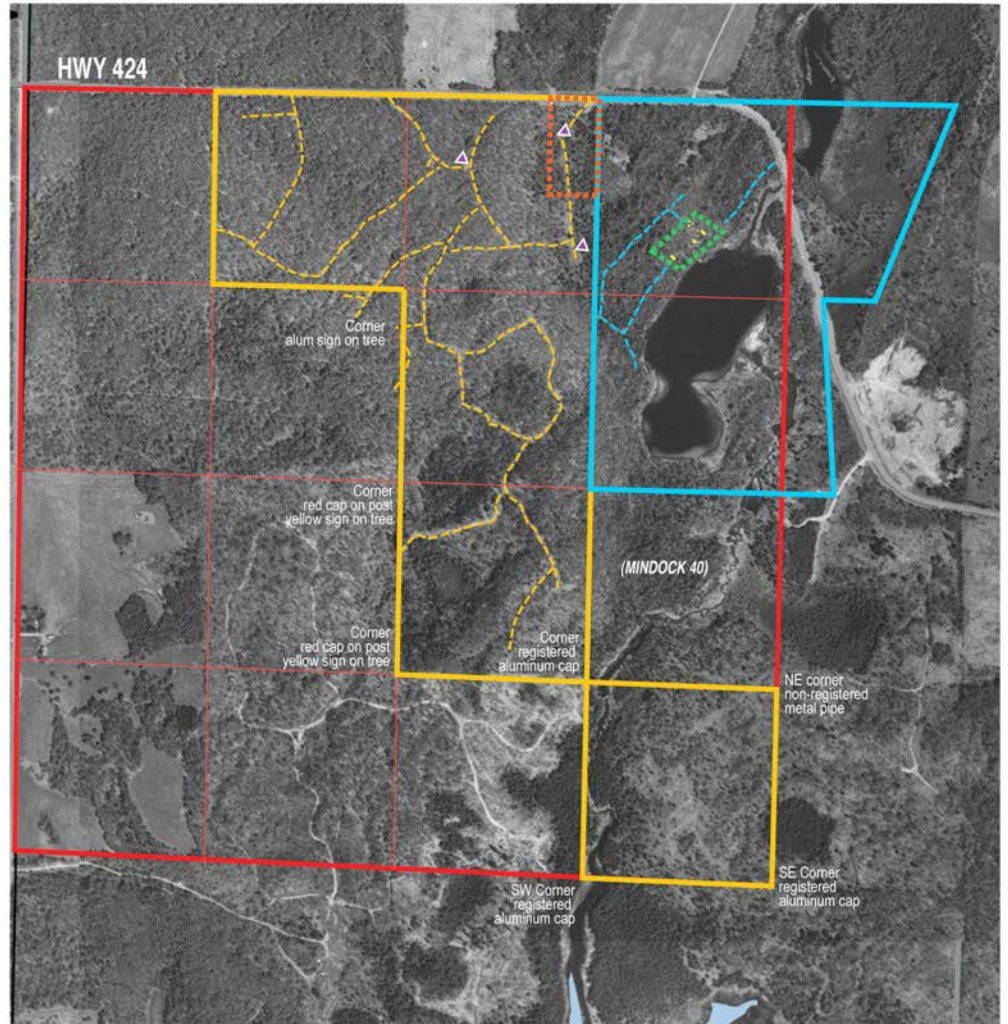

-  3 existing dumps (being removed over time)

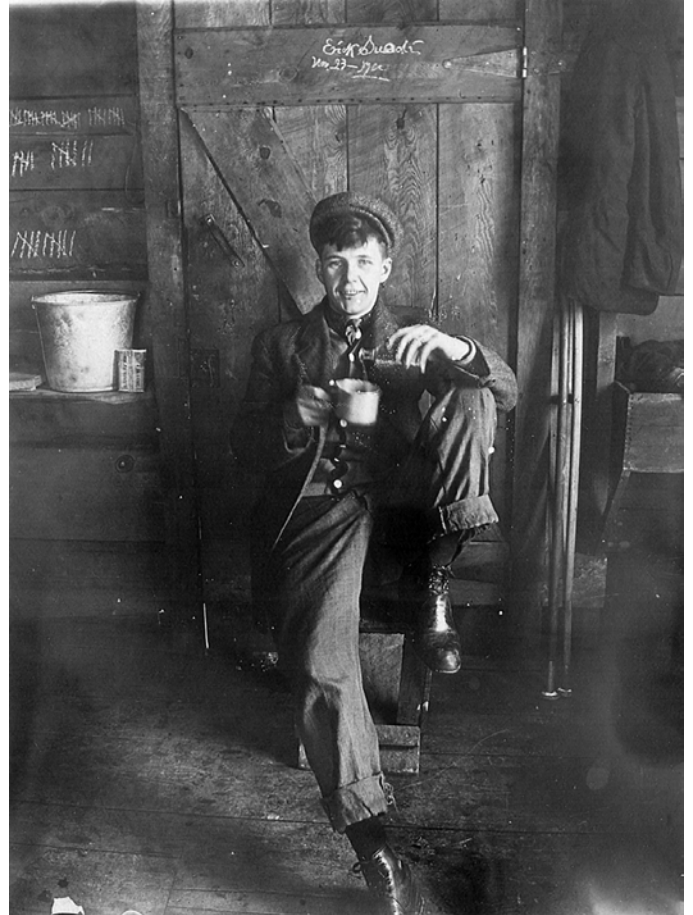
-  Blue Lake I Conservation Easement (120 acres)
